incredible

incredible (adj.)-
unbelievable

example sentence:

When we finally reached the top of the mountain, I saw the view,
an incredible one.



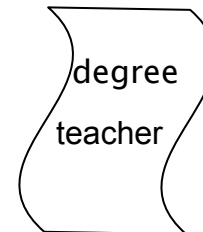
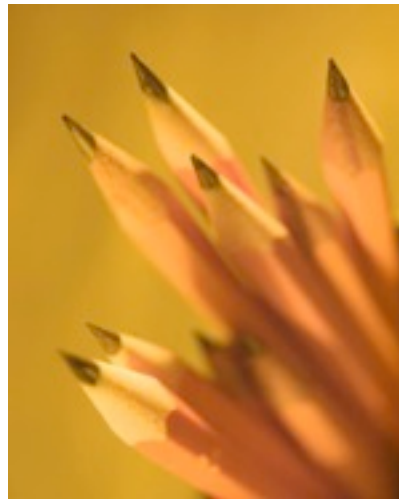
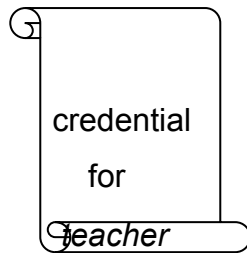
credential

credential (n.)-

degree for people to believe you that you are a teacher, doctor, coach, (etc.)

example sentence:

Now people know I'm a teacher because I have a teacher credential.



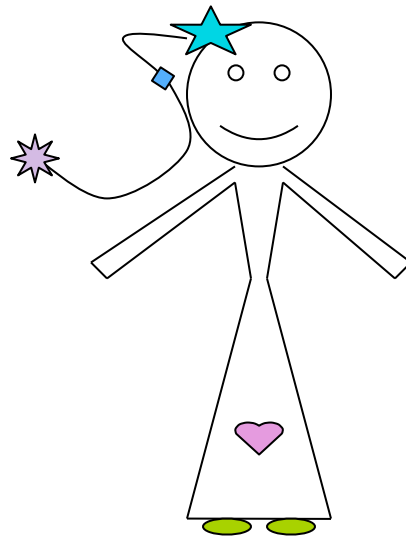
credit

credit (n.)-

being believed by someone

example sentence:

It feels wonderful to get credit by someone.



credible

credible (adj.)-

believable or opposite of *incredible*

example sentence:

Kenny's story, about Disney Land, is so credible because I had been there before.

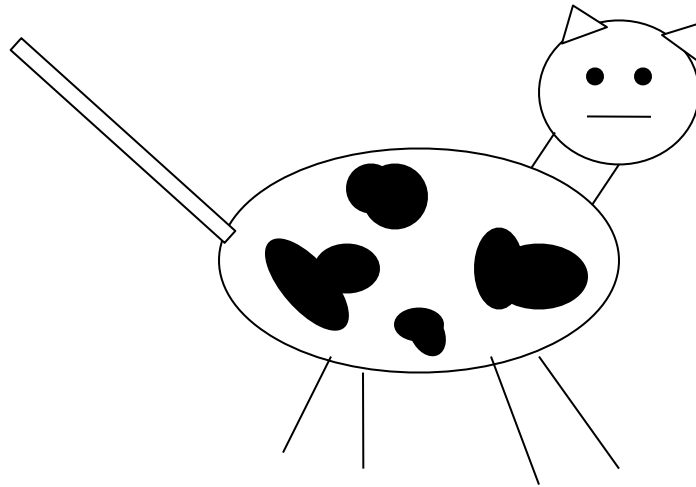


sacred

sacred (adj.)-
really important

example sentence:

The cow is sacred to the Indians.
